Course Syllabus

Course Information

Contact Hours: 120 4 weeks

Course Description

The course is aimed at students who have a general mastery of the language to communicate in familiar everyday situations. The aim of this course is for students to be able to perform in a broader spectrum of everyday situations and to acquire the minimum skills to develop in the academic and work environment. The course promotes the development of strategies to solve the difficulties of lack of vocabulary and aims to exploit the experience of the context of immersion and everyday contact with the language to maximize the learning of Spanish and foster the knowledge of the cultural patterns of Argentina.

After completing the course, students will be able to talk about everyday facts and work; describe and narrate experiences and events in detail; express desires and expectations; tell arguments from movies or books and express personal impressions; express plans and opinions; give and receive instructions and recommendations. They will be able to write and understand brief reports and personal letters, extract information from brochures of general interest and recognize the main ideas of short texts. You will be able to understand conversations at a slow pace and the central argument of simple movies.

Course Requirements

Students must meet the requirement of 85% attendance to class in order to avoid losing regularity. Up to two unjustified absences may be committed without affecting the final score. Lack of punctuality (arrival more than ten minutes late or leaving before class ends) will be considered half-absences. The only way to excuse an absence is to submit a doctor's note the following class after the absence. In case of not attending class, it is the students' responsibility to contact their peers or their professor to find out and do the assignments for the next class. On the other hand, it is at the discretion of the professor to accept out-of-term papers (having missed the previous class does not justify not completing the assignments) Students are expected to participate actively in the classes and conduct an oral presentation whose topic and date will be agreed with the professor during the course.

Class 3	Describe qualities and states of people and things. Avoid repetitions. Review of usages of "Ser & Estar". Direct and indirect object pronouns
Class 4	Express rules, give instructions and make recommendations. Informal and formal imperative. Position of objective and reflective pronouns with verbs in Imperative.
Class 5	Talk about actions completed in the past. Locate events in the past. Expressing reactions and comments. Past Perfect Simple Review. Use of " <i>hacer</i> ". Uses of " <i>ya</i> " and " <i>todavia</i> ".
Week 2	
Class 6	Make descriptions in the past. Talk about common actions in the past. Make comparisons. Past Imperfect. Comparative structures.
Class 7	Narrate and describe in Past tense. Contrast between Past Perfect Simple and Imperfect Past.
Class 8	Narrate and describe in Past tense. Use of prepositions " <i>a, con, contra, de, desde, en, entre, hacia, hasta, según, sin</i> and <i>sobre".</i>

Class 9 Mid-Term exam.

Uses of prepositions "*para"* and "*por"*. Review of adjectives and indefinite pronouns.

Week 3

- **Class 10** Express logical and temporal relations between events. Past Perfect tense. Logical and temporal connectors.
- Class 11 Talk in Future tense. Make predictions. Simple Future tense.
- Class 12 Express real conditions. Real condition phrase.
- **Class 13** Make polite requests. Talk about imaginary situations. Simple Conditional. Present Indicative and Conditional to make requests.
