Course Description

This course focuses on aspects of Argentine and Latin American culture with an emphasis on popular culture, both written and visual. Based on the study of diverse texts (literature, newspapers, comics, murals, photographs, fiction films and documentaries, podcasts), the course will reflect on the idea of culture and consider it from a very broad perspective, including the distinction between “high” and “low” culture. Students will refine their oral and written skills while deepening their reading comprehension and enriching their understanding of contemporary Latin American culture.

Course requirements, attendance and punctuality

Student should have 75% attendance to class in order to avoid losing. The attendance control system is electronic. The professor also keeps track of attendance, since it is part of the course grade (see Grading policy). Lack of punctuality (arriving more than 10 minutes late or leaving class early) will be considered a half absence. If they do not attend class, it is the students’ responsibility to contact their classmates to find out and complete the homework for the next class. Being absent from a class does not justify not completing the homework.

Participation and work in class

Students must actively participate in classes and make oral presentations. During semester, students will have homework and assignments for each class, which the are part of the final grade. Delay in the delivery of the assignments negatively affects the grade. A high level of student participation is expected. The professor will evaluate the students’ personal commitment, curiosity and contribution.

Plagiarism

Presenting words, ideas or any information as if they were own is plagiarism and constitutes intellectual theft. The student who commits an act of plagiarism will not receive credit for the class.

Oral presentations

Oral presentations must be made in the students' own words; they cannot be read, although they may be supported by notes (the professor will evaluate the relevance of the “notes” in each case).
