Course Description

The course focuses on critical and analytical thinking of social representations of gender and sexual identity, and their symbolic effects in contemporary Latin American cultures. In the globalized world, cultural artifacts aimed at mass culture are a way of influence, manipulation and/or negotiation in the construction of social and personal identity, in public, private and intimate spaces.

In this course, canonical theoretical texts are analyzed in the construction and discussion of genre theory in Latin America; Latin American literary texts, interviews, testimonies and other expressions of culture (popular music, documentaries, TV, films, current news, social networks) that protect, question, subvert, interpret and/or represent femininity, masculinity and sexuality.

In short, this course encourages students to think critically about the narratives, images, and practices that perpetuate, negotiate, and/or politically confront gender and sexuality norms both in Buenos Aires and in the rest of Latin America.

Students are expected to enrich their abilities both to observe their socio-cultural environment and to establish open and assertive relationships with it, also to interpret, evaluate, listen, read, think, speak and write critically.

Course Requirements and students' responsibility

Read the assigned texts carefully before coming to class; consult new vocabulary; have elaborate questions about their concerns or doubts; participate actively and respectfully in group discussions; Maintain an academic environment of tolerance in the class.

Attend at least 75% of the classes to meet the basic objectives of the course. Unexcused absences will affect the students' participation grade, the exams and individual or group assignments evaluated in class during their absence.

The attendance control system is electronic and mandatory.

Academic requirements of the course:

During the academic semester, students:

- Will write a short essay (5-6 pages, double spaced).
- Will have two in-person exams (Mid-term and Final Exam)
- They will have 6 individual and random reading controls.
- They will have group activities on the Course Reading texts assigned.
- They will conduct two presentations on the topic of their essay.

Assignments will be delivered on the assigned deadline. This may be modified at the professors' discretion. Students are expected to consult the digital library (Jstor / Wilson Web) to support their required readings, and the final

essay.

Plagiarism: It is the policy of the university to suspend for two years any student who commits plagiarism. This decision will affect not only the course in which the plagiarism occurred but also the other courses of the semester that the student is taking. **Wikipedia is excluded** as an authorized source of consultation.
