Course Overview

The course is dedicated to the critical reading and analysis of this Central American storytelling from the 20th and early 21st centuries, with special emphasis on the most recent trends, in the Central American regional context from a comparative and contrastive perspective, recognizing the historical processes in the which narrative texts are produced.

The course is aimed at students who wish to understand the development of Central American literature through stories, for which representative texts by authors from the different countries that make up the Central American area have been selected chronologically.

To achieve learning, students must understand, comment on and contrast the assigned texts, prepare reading reports and make oral presentations.
